**Description of Course:**

The Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) Program is a 10-week course that prepares students to take the CNA examination given by the American Red Cross. The program is approved by the Department of Health Services. The course includes 50 hours of theory and 100 hours of clinical experience.

The Home Health Aide program is a 3 ½ week program that prepares students to work with clients in the home care setting. (Note- the Home Health Aide program was put on hold in spring, 2012 due to budget constraints)

**Labor Market Data:**

Employment of nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants is expected to grow by 20 percent from 2010 to 2020, faster than the average for all occupations. Because of the growing elderly population, many nursing aides, orderlies, and attendants will be needed in long-term care facilities, such as nursing homes. The median pay for CNAs is \$11.54 per hour or \$24,010 per year.

A recent informal survey of local health care facilities in the area found that most agencies continue to have a need for CNAs.
